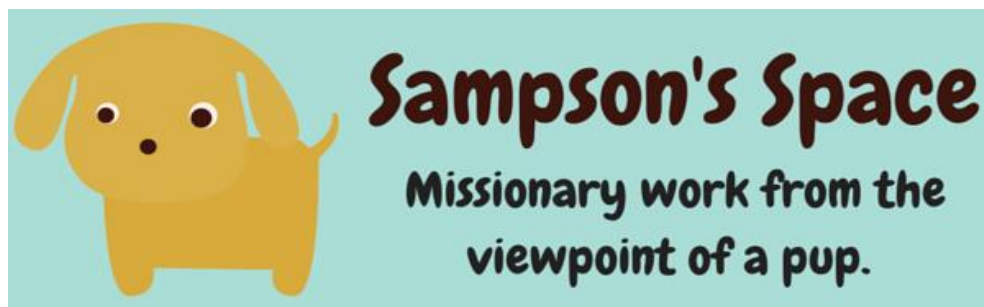

I had so much fun at youth camp guys! Mom walked me around a lot and I got to make friends with all the teens attending the camp! Sometimes they would just let me hang out with them

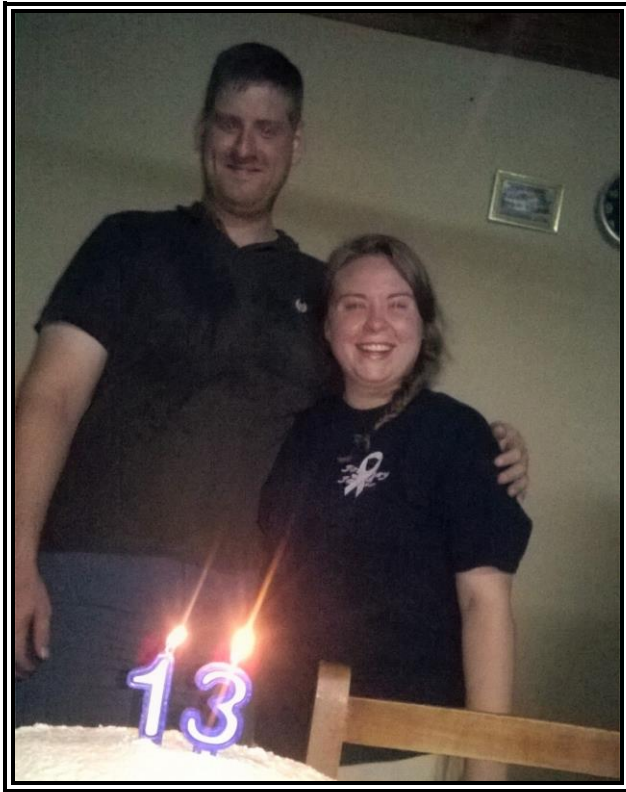

## Happy Birthday Stephen!!!!



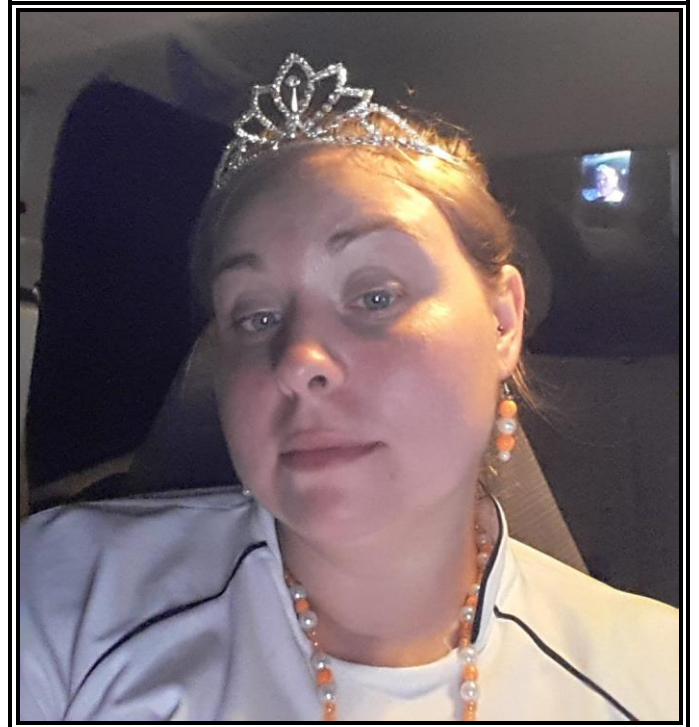
