UPDATE

It has only been about 2 weeks since the February newsletter got out but I just wanted to give an update on what is happening here.

Dan had a great trip to the Chaco to visit the church in La Rosa Cue. He will be heading back up to the Chaco next week to do an evangelistic campaign. He has been asked to come into an indigenous community where there is no church operating to do a campaign. Please pray for the people of La Patria to receive God's word and for Dan as he prepares to go to minister there. He is making his preparations now for next week. Today we bought a Coleman cooler because he has to take in his own food, water and ice for the days he will be there. He will be taking his battery operated, portable sound system that he can use there with no electricity.

We have been made aware by the Pastor of La Rosa Cue, of some elderly indigenous people, who have no family to take care of them, needing some sheets and mosquito nets. We hope to be able to meet those needs for this trip to the Chaco. I already have a couple of boxes of clothes and things that Dan will be taking with him to share with our brothers and sisters there.

We are also praying for the weather because if it rains there it is almost impossible to get in and out of the area. The forecast is calling for rain next week, which we desperately need, but we are praying that it doesn't interfere with the campaign plans.

Dan and I and the new National Youth Director, Suni, just got back this morning from Ciudad del Este. We participated in 2 local church services. Dan asked Suni to preach the two services and the Lord truly used her. It was so nice for me just to go and enjoy as Assistant National Youth Director. Of course in both services the Pastor asked me, as wife of their District Overseer, to come and say a few words and to do my favorite thing, pray for people in the altar.

Dan will be heading back on April 15th to Ciudad del Este for a special service for a building fund campaign that he started there on his last visit. The church is wanting to buy a property. The National Overseer came up with an idea for each family or individual to buy so many square meters of the property. They are really excited about the idea! On the 15th they are to present their first monies pledged.

We have a missionary friend who taught us a wonderful saying "Don't wait until someone dies to send them flowers". Meaning bless people by your words now to their face. That is exactly what our brothers and sisters did in Ciudad del Este. They truly love Dan and spoke such wonderful things to us that we felt humbled and truly privileged for the opportunity to work with them and excited about the future.

In our first service in Carapegua there were 4 people in attendance. We set a goal to have 20 people in attendance by the end of March. We have been visiting members and friends of the church. Two weeks ago there were 20 people in the Sunday service. We praise the Lord for that! Now the goal is 40! Nothing is impossible with God!

We took 15 people from Carapegua, last Saturday night, to support another church in our area. They were having a chicken dinner to raise money to buy doors for their church that is under construction. Some of you reading this have visited the Quiindy church before when all that was there was the foundation of the church and we showed the Jesus film there.

What a blessing to see this little country church through the various building stages and see how God is calling the youth to different areas of ministry there.

Dan and I have been participating in an intensive seminary course. It is being held in our local church in Carapegua for our area pastors and leaders. This Monday will be the final day of the Old Testament course. The course has been very interesting and has been great getting together with everyone but I must admit it has been physically hard on me. We have wooden folding chairs in our church so to sit from 9-5 (with an hour for lunch) has been hard on my back. I really miss the white plastic chairs that we have here at the camp.

Near Quyquyho, Dan and Angel went and met with the family that have requested services in their home. Starting tomorrow we will be having services there also. Please pray for God's strength. The Sunday schedule now is Dan and I in Carapegua at 8:30am, Pastor Angel does music here at the camp for the 9:00am service. Service in Quyquyho at 4:00 and Mboi Cae at 6:00. Praise the Lord that after a long delay, for various reasons, the construction has started again on the multi-use building in Quyquyho. Thanks to our friends of the Ward Ave. (High Point) church for this project. The brick layer has started on the next phase of construction. Right now he is preparing the steel so nothing really shows up in pictures yet but hopefully for the April newsletter we will have pictures of the progress. We have been waiting on God's timing and it is now.
